November Speaker Spotlight



Our Guest Speaker was **Kimberly Wallace, Durham Public Schools.** -She began her Education career in 2002 in the EC Department. She attended the University of West Georgia, she is a mother of three beautiful boys. Kimberly has self published her first Children's book titled Mason's World, based off her childhood experiences and those of her sons. She's a proud member of Delta Sigma

Theta Sorority Inc and has been in her current role as New Teacher Mentor since 2016. Her presentation theme was "Being a New Teacher". Mrs. Wallace shared that within four to five new teachers burnout and it occurs in the first five years

of teaching. The EC teacher's burnout is highest, within the first 2 years. Many of our teachers have alternative licenses which is stressful. The school systems needs to provide more emotional support for all teachers especially beginning teachers. The expectations of teaching are more demanding. New teachers need more than learning classroom management, how to dress professionally, how to provide appropriate instruction to all students, time management plus some



are working and attending college part-time to get fully certified. She encouraged our organization to get involved by giving gift cards and even volunteering in the classrooms."

2023 NC DKG Convention Project

The 2023 NC DKG Convention Project will provide support



for the Food Bank of the Albemarle. This agency works to fight hunger and poverty in 15 NC counties, including Beaufort, Bertie, Camden, Chowan, Currituck, Dare, Gates, Hertford, Hyde, Martin, Northampton, Pasquotank, Perquimans, Tyrrell, and Washington.

NC DKG will collect monetary donations and food items including canned meats, proteins, vegetables, fruits and soups; dry goods such as pasta, cereal, rice and dried beans; and toiletries such as personal hygiene items, toilet tissue, and laundry soap that are necessary essentials that clients cannot obtain with food stamp benefits.

Monetary donations may be made on the convention registration form. They will also be accepted at a table set up at the convention. Checks and money orders may be written to Food Bank of the Albemarle with reference to the 2023 NC DKG Convention Project.
